Sanctification Lesson 24

- 1. <u>SANCTIFICATION</u> is one of the <u>GREAT TRUTHS</u> of the scripture. With the Holy Spirit as our TEACHER let us seek His GUIDANCE in understanding its meaning.
- 2. Sanctification is divided into <u>THREE</u> different aspects.
 - A. In the <u>PAST</u> with our <u>NEW BIRTH</u>. 1 Cor. 6:11
 - B. In the PRESENT as a DAILY PROCESS. Romans 8:29
 - C. In the <u>FUTURE</u> when we are transformed <u>BODY AND SOUL</u> into the image of Christ. 1 John 3:2
- 3. There are **TWO** specific **FALSE TEACHINGS** regarding sanctification. They are:
 - A. <u>ANTINOMIAN</u> which means that since forgiveness is found in Christ, <u>IT IS OK</u> to do the things that the <u>BIBLE FORBIDS</u>. The more one sins, the more God can show His <u>GRACE</u>. Paul refutes this kind of thinking in Romans 6:1 and 2.
 - B. <u>PERFECTIONISM</u> which means we can arrive at a state of <u>SINLESSNESS</u> in this life. Paul refutes this position in Romans 7:15-25. See also 1 John 1:8
- 4. Sanctification means to be <u>SET APART</u> for a purpose. The <u>PURPOSE OF GOD</u>.
- 5. The Old Testament uses sanctify to mean <u>THINGS</u> while the New Testament uses set apart to mean <u>PEOPLE</u>. (This is a general statement. There are times the idea is reversed in the Old and New.)
- 6. In the <u>PAST</u> God <u>SANCTIFIED</u> us. 1 Corinthians 6:11; 2 Thessalonians 2:14; and 1 Peter 1:2 (Positional Sanctification)
- 7. <u>TODAY</u> God is in <u>THE PROCESS</u> of sanctifying us. John 17:14-19; Colossians 1:10; 2 Peter 3:18; Romans 12:1 and 2 (Practical Sanctification)
- 8. Our <u>ULTIMATE SANCTIFICATION</u> comes <u>TOMORROW</u>. We will be <u>PERFECTED</u> in Him. Ephesians 5:27; 1 Thess. 3:12 and 13; 1 Thess. 5:23 and 24; 1 John 3:2
- 9. We <u>CANNOT</u> be completely sanctified here on earth because our body is <u>IMPERFECT</u> and it is a part of <u>COMPLETE SANCTIFICATION</u>. 1 Thess. 5:23
- 10. There are FOUR sources of sanctification. The TRINITY and the WORD OF GOD.
- 11. <u>GOD THE FATHER</u> sanctifies. Jude 1 (KJV reads: "Them that are sanctified by God the Father.")
- 12. Sanctification is of CHRIST. Hebrews 10:10 and 14; 1 Cor. 6:11

- 13. The HOLY SPIRIT is active in sanctification. 2 Thess. 2:13; Romans 15:16 and 1 Peter 1:2
- 14. Sanctification is by the WORD OF GOD. John 17:17; Ephesians 5:26
- 15. There is to be **EVIDENCE** of sanctification in the **BELIEVER'S LIFE**.
- 16. SAINTS are to SERVE. John 17:20; Matthew 28:18-20; Ephesians 2:10; Hebrews 13:20 & 21
- 17. Those of us who have been sanctified are to manifest <u>THE FRUIT OF THE SPIRIT</u>. Galatians 5:22 and 23
- 18. Saints must <u>LOVE</u> and be <u>OBEDIENT</u> to the <u>WORD OF GOD</u>. Psalm 119
- 19. A person who is both <u>SANCTIFIED</u> and <u>BEING</u> sanctified must <u>RESIST</u> the work of <u>SATAN</u> to distract them from the goal. James 4:7 and 8
- 20. Saints of God should SUBMIT and HUMBLE themselves to Him. James 4:7a, 8a, and 10a
- 21. Saints should live HOLY LIVES. 1 Peter 1:15

Conclusion

Sanctification is presented in three tenses. The past, present and future. Every born again believer *has already been* sanctified (set apart, dedicated, consecrated, separated), and that sanctification is once and for all. We are *now being* sanctified through the Spirit and the Word. We *shall be* ultimately, wholly, completely sanctified when we meet the Lord Jesus Christ.

Every Christian still has two natures -- the old Adamic, carnal nature and the new spiritual nature (1 Corinthians 3:1-3). The growth of the spiritual comes through a daily dedication, a daily cleansing (1 John 1:9), a daily study of the Word, a constant prayer in the heart. We grow in sanctification -- we can never grow to the point of total sanctification in this life. Every believer is a "saint," a person "set apart" to God. "Wherefore Jesus also, that He might sanctify the people with His own blood, suffered without the gate" (Hebrews 13:12).
