Conclusion

The truth of this lesson can best be set forth by example, an illustration taken from Acts 16:19-34. Paul and Silas have been put in jail at Philippi. At the midnight hour, in jail with wounds on their backs, what do you think they were doing? They were not complaining and pitying themselves. Those two "*living stones*" - two "*holy priests*" - were offering the sacrifice of praise to God. The Scripture says, "And at midnight Paul and Silas prayed, and sang praises unto God; and the prisoners heard them" (Acts 16:25). They were there also as "*royal priests*." How does this virtue show in their action? In the touching words of Paul, "Do thyself no harm, for we are all here" (Acts 16:28).

The voices of the "holy priests" offered the sacrifice of praise and did their work there at the throne of God; and the words of the "royal priests" went directly to the jailer's heart and did their work there. The two "*living stones, holy priests, royal priests,*" glorified God; and the jailer and his family were saved.

This is "the priesthood of the believer." If you are a Christian, then "there is one God, and one mediator between God and man - the Man, Christ Jesus" (1 Timothy 2:5).
