Conclusion

The King, Jesus, and His Kingdom are real, actual, literal. The Kingdom of Heaven is the Kingdom of Jesus Christ upon the earth. He shall reign and rule as King of Kings and Lord of Lords. The Old and New Testaments present the Kingdom Age. There is no way for us to explain it away when we compare Scripture with Scripture.

The church shall be called out before Jesus literally comes to the earth (1 Thessalonians 4:13-18; 2 Thessalonians 2:1-7). Read again Zechariah 14:4-7.

The church, the bride of Christ, shall return with Christ when He comes to set up His Kingdom. We, the church, shall reign with Him (2 Timothy 2:12; Revelation 5:10). Read Zechariah 14:5. Notice in that prophecy "all the saints" shall return with Jesus to the Mount of Olives. If you are saved, you are an heir of God and joint heir with Christ. If you are "born again," you are in the Kingdom of God. If you are not "born again," you face eternal doom and judgment. In Revelation 22:17 you read, "The Spirit and the bride say, come." This last invitation is from God the Holy Spirit and the bride, the church. The triune God and all the members of the body, the bride of Christ, say, "Come."
